Neil S. Hirsch TMS Center

- First FACTMS Sponsored TMS Clinic
- Opened in May 2024 at Kitsap Mental Health Services
- Through July 2024, 44 patients have been referred, 32 are scheduled for evaluations and 9 are currently receiving treatment.

Bob Sammons Clinical TMS Research Grant

- Provides funding up to \$25,000 for 2 years
- Awarded the first grant, June 15 to Xiaolong Peng, PhD from MUSC

Membership Renewal Schedule



The CTMSS will be moving from anniversary-based membership renewals to an annual membership cycle.

The benefits of doing so:

- Consistency in revenue and budgeting projections
- Improved member retention
- Reduction in administration tasks as related to lapsed memberships

Timeline:

- Renewal invoices will go out November 1
- Current members who have already paid will receive pro-rated dues as they transition to the annual membership cycle
